## What is COVID-19 (Coronavirus)?

- A virus related to other coronaviruses that cause the common cold but can cause severe health effects
- It is highly contagious, easily spread from person to person
- In less than a year, it has infected 6.7 million and has killed 200,000 people in the US alone



## What is COVID-19 (Coronavirus)?

- Symptoms may include fever, cough, shortness of breath, headaches, chills, muscle aches, sore throat, fatigue, congestion, runny nose, loss of sense of taste or smell, nausea, vomiting, and/or diarrhea
- Some infected people show no symptoms (asymptomatic)
- Symptoms typically begin 2 14 days after exposure



## What is COVID-19 (Coronavirus)?

- It is spread from person to person, mainly through respiratory droplets from someone who is infected
- It can spread to others from coughing, sneezing, singing, yelling, or from just talking
- It can also spread from contact with contaminated surfaces or objects

#### What do you do if you feel sick?

- If you believe you have the coronavirus, stay home and call your healthcare provider.
- Let the Elections Office know that you can no longer serve.
- If you have been infected, you may not have had symptoms for several days but may have passed the infection onto co-workers.

# If you test positive for COVID-19 Your healthcare provider will advise you on procedures to follow. Immediately let the Elections Office know as so we can take appropriate action, i.e., cleaning and disinfecting the site, notifying co-workers that may have been exposed. The Elections Office will consult with

- The Elections Office will consult with Public Health and may have to replace the entire vote center team or shut down the site.
