# **Emergency Procedures for Polling Place**

If you have an emergency situation and you have to evacuate the polling place, here are some guidelines:

#### Fire

- Locate the Fire Alarm & all emergency exits in the area shortly after opening the polls.
- If the Fire Alarm goes off, exit building using safest route.

#### Earthquake

- When the shaking starts, practice DROP, COVER, and HOLD. DROP down on the floor, take COVER under a sturdy desk, table or other furniture, and HOLD onto it and be prepared to move with it.
- Stay indoors until shaking stops and you're sure it's safe to exit. Find a clear spot away from buildings, trees, and power lines.
- If you are outdoors, find a clear spot away from buildings, trees, streetlights and power lines. Drop to the ground and stay there until the shaking stops.
- If you are in your car, slow down and drive to a clear place.

If there is time to pick up some things, consider taking the following in order of priority:

- Ballot Box (containing <u>all</u> Voted Ballots)
- Unused Ballots & secrecy envelopes
- Roster & Alpha Index
- Pencils, pens & Marking Pens for Voting
- Precinct issued Cell Phone

With the above items, you could continue servicing the voters outside or at a new location.

If you are unable to retrieve the above items before leaving the building, <u>lock the</u> <u>door when exiting</u>.

If, during the evacuation timeframe, voters are unable to vote, make a list of voters who were unable to vote and get phone numbers where the voters can be reached that day so the Registrar of Voters Office can find a way to get them ballots before 8:00 p.m.

Ultimately, just do what you can, but mainly take care of yourself, other workers and the voters around you.

# **Safety Procedures at Polling Place**

### Safe Lifting Technique

- Size up the load; <u>ask</u> for help, if needed
- Bend at your knees, not your waist to lift an object don't stoop
- Keep your back straight
- Get a good grip
- Lift with your legs, not your back
- Don't twist your body

### **Vehicle Accident Report**

- If serious injury is involved, call Highway Patrol or local Law Enforcement Officers.
- Call the ROV Office (565-6800) immediately, and ask to speak to a Supervisor or Manager.
- **DO NOT** make any admission of liability or authorize any repairs.
- **DO NOT** discuss the accident with anyone except the police or authorized county officials.
- Complete the Accident Report Form (located in the Binder, regardless of the amount of damage) to obtain other driver information, gather names, addresses & phone numbers of witnesses.

**Reminder:** California law prohibits the use of cell phones <u>unless</u> <u>using a hands-free device while driving</u>. If you must make a call, please do so after stopping the vehicle safely off the road.

## **Polling Place Injuries**

- Injuries should be reported to the ROV Office immediately.
- Call the ROV Office (565-6800) and ask to speak with a Supervisor.

## **General Polling Place Safety**

- Be aware of ALL potential hazards in and around Polling Place.
- **DO NOT** put Precinct Board table in a place that will block emergency route out of room.
- Be sure that any extension cords do not present a tripping hazard.
- Report any potential hazards to Polling Place contact.
